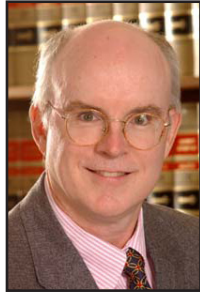


Guest Speaker

Bill has served as counsel on countless critical issues ranging from post-Katrina social justice to the right to dissent, and from public housing in the U.S. to human rights in

Haiti. In 2009 he was named Legal Director of the Center for Constitutional Rights, charged with helping the center grow its work in racial, social, and economic justice. He has been a law professor and director of the clinic at the Gillis Long Poverty Law Center at Loyola University in New Orleans, a volunteer lawyer with the School of the Americas Watch, Human Rights Watch USA, and Amnesty International USA.

About his book, Ending Poverty as We Know It, Lani Guiner wrote: "Bill Quigley draws on the common sense of Thomas Paine, the moral inspiration of Martin Luther King, Jr., and the political wisdom of Franklin Delano Roosevelt to issue a bold challenge for our society... in a book that is both visionary and practical."

His most recent thought-provoking book, published in 2008, is entitled Storms Still Raging: Katrina, New Orleans and Social Justice.
