He became active in Nicaragua and Cuba solidarity work in the 1980s and has travelled to both countries on work brigades, political tours, and with Pastors for Peace.

Directions:

Going North on I-80, take Macdonald Ave. West Richmond exit, go west on Macdonald to Civic Center Plaza, between 27th and 25th Streets. Turn right into the Civic Center complex of widely spaced buildings; the Library is on the left side, where there is ample parking.

Going South on I-80, take San Pablo Ave./Barrett Ave. exit, and head west on Barrett (toward the Bay). Barrett is parallel to Macdonald which is two blocks south. Get over onto Macdonald, and then follow the above directions.

The Madeline Whittlesey Community Room has a separate entrance at the back of a shade tree patio, on the left of the main Library entrance.
